We held the first meetings of our new **Player Committee** for this season. Following two successful seasons with a club committee, we were excited to welcome our new members and get to know them. We were joined by 35 players representing teams across the club, providing a broad range of perspectives. The group contributed thoughtfully, sharing why they play football, what makes them feel safe and supported, what they enjoy most about training and matches, and suggestions for improvements to both their teams and the club.



Key themes that emerged from both sessions were that it is their teammates, coaches, and families that make them feel safe and supported, and that playing with their friends is what makes football most fun for them. We also captured a number of ideas for improvements, which will be taken forward to the next Club Committee meeting. We then discussed the importance of goal setting. Each player wrote a personal goal for the season and reflected on a highlight from the season so far, it was lovely to read their responses and see their enthusiasm.

YOU SAID, WE DID!

A fantastic 76 of you completed our recent survey circulated to all members, thank you!

Based on feedback from this, as well as other ways we have heard from you, we want to update you on a few things where you told us you wanted to see change or more information.

- For new players joining the club from October onwards within the season, **memberships** will be charged at £25p/m + a one off fee of £25
- We've heard that not everyone knows where to find some of our key documents, which underpin everything NTJFC and some of you weren't familiar with what this meant in practice.
- In our mission to ensure that all players across the club get the same opportunities, regardless of the team, we are keen to embed our **approach to equal and fair game time**.
- It was evident from the survey that many of our members may not be aware of the **24 Hour Rule**, which was developed to help us make sure that feedback to our volunteers is given in an appropriate and managed way.

Meet the Welfare Team at NTJFC

Making sure everyone is safe and happy at our club is our priority and we are lucky enough to have 3 Welfare Officers at NTJFC!

Emma Brown - I have been in role for 4 years. Prior to this year I ensured coach compliance, addressed safeguarding concerns and issued support and advice. I have set up and run the players committee which is now in its 3rd season and is being used as a best practice example in the FA. You will see me at matches and training and I enjoy getting to know players and parents. I have over 10 years of safeguarding and welfare experience working mainly in education. I work as a Student Experience and Wellbeing Manager for a group of colleges and volunteer as a mentor for Trauma Research UK supporting people with trauma and mental health difficulties.

Sarah Gazzard - I've been involved with the NTJFC for the past three years, initially starting out in a fundraising role. During this time, I became part of the Player Committee, which was an extremely positive and inspiring experience and played a big part in motivating me to become more involved. That journey led to me joining the safeguarding team. I'm passionate about supporting the club and helping to create a safe, positive environment for all players. 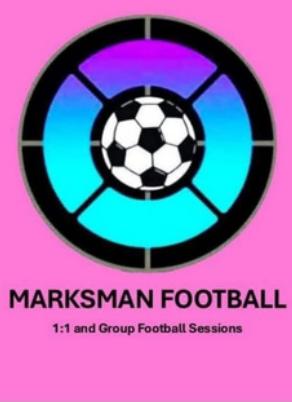
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
